Cost of Living for July 2023



"MALAWI FACES ECONOMIC DILEMMA AS COST OF LIVING SHOWS NO SIGNS OF RETREAT"

According to Centre for Social Concern's monthly Urban Basic Needs Basket surveys done in Lilongwe, Zomba, Blantyre, Mzuzu, Mangochi and Karonga, it indicates that the cost of living still continues to increase, leaving Malawians in an economic dilemma.

Between June and July 2023, the average cost of living has increased by 4.5% from MK378,812 in June to MK395,993 in July. In July, Blantyre has been the most expensive city at MK452,013 while Karonga was the lowest at MK318,599. The main contributor to this increased cost of living is an increase in the maize prices in all the markets we collect data.

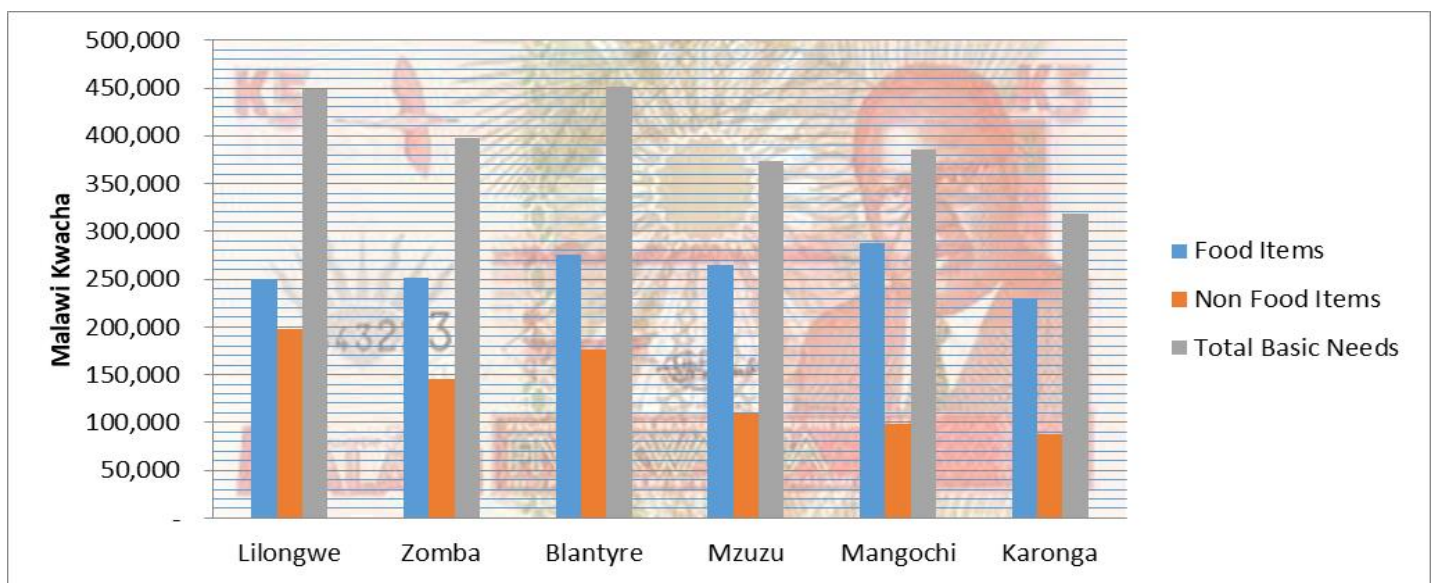

INCREASED MAIZE PRICES AS THE MAIN CONTRIBUTOR TO THE RISING COST OF LIVING

The main contributor to the increased cost of living has been the skyrocketing maize prices. On average, between June and July 2023, maize prices increased by 26.2%. The highest being Mangochi where maize prices increased by 40%, from MK27,000 in June to MK38,000 in July per 50 kg bag. In Karonga, maize prices increased by 8%, from MK25,000 in June to MK27,000 per 50 kg bag in July.

SOME OF THE EFFECTS OF THE INCREASED COST OF LIVING AMONG MALAWIANS

Financial Strain: Rising prices for essential goods and services, such as food, housing, healthcare, and transportation, put significant financial strain on individuals and families. This leads to increased debt, reduced savings, and a decreased ability to invest in education or business opportunities.

Rising Unemployment: As businesses face higher operating costs due to inflation, they may cut back on hiring or even lay off workers. This can contribute to rising unemployment rates, making it harder for people to find stable employment.
